

Purpose

Kpokissa Farming Project grows sustainable harvests, creates dignified jobs, and provides steady nourishment and support for vulnerable children and families.

This 12-month pilot will establish a reliable vegetable supply for a children's home, and develop surplus production that can help support food needs across other partner homes.

12-month targeted goals

- Prepare and cultivate vegetable plots with climate-appropriate crops and a simple production calendar.
- Provide regular fresh produce deliveries to a partner children's home throughout the year.
- Train and employ local workers in practical, sustainable methods (soil health, composting, water efficiency).
- Create a small surplus for local sales to reinvest into seeds, inputs, and future expansion.
- Track yields, costs, and deliveries monthly; share quarterly updates with supporters.

Soil inputs (compost, amendments, organic treatments)	1,800
Water & irrigation setup (hoses, storage, repairs)	3,000
Labor stipends (farm manager + assistants)	5,200
Storage & post-harvest handling (crates, tarp, small shed)	1,700
Transport to children's home (fuel, local delivery)	1,200
Training & agronomy coaching	1,200
Monitoring, reporting & safeguards (10%)	1,900
